

#### 5-56 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND DEVELOPMENT

Newspapers, particularly those operating job printing plants and selling paper stocks and other supplies, are subject to the taxation of \$6.00 imposed by Section 48-410, Idaho Code. (Graydon W. Smith)

6-56 ALL PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS AND COUNTY AUDITORS

The position of names of candidates shall be alternated in

printing is applicable to the judicial ballot. (Graydon W. Smith)

7-56 STATE BOARD OF CANVASSERS

Statutes in our State do not provide for a recount of votes in primary election for nomination of candidate for U.S. Senate. Board has no authority to recount or have others recount votes. (Graydon W. Smith)

### 8-56 EARLE E. KOEHLER, COMMISSIONER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT

Pinball machines accompanied by any sort of scheme so that a pay-off of any kind is possible would constitute a gambling device and be subject to seizure and destruction under the laws of this State. (Graydon W. Smith)

## 9-56 ROSS LEONARD, DIRECTOR, DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

Requirements for a valid purchase of a resident fish and game license are that the party purchasing such license be a bona fide resident of the State of Idaho residing in this State for a period of at least six months prior to purchase. Members of armed services stationed within Idaho are entitled to purchase resident fish and game licenses. Idaho residents attending school at out-of-state institutions are entitled to purchase licenses. (T. J. Jones III)

#### 10-56 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

State Board of Education is obligated to deduct the minimum salaries of non-certified teachers employed by any school district from the minimum salary allowances under the minimum program. (Elbert E. Gass)

#### 11-56 SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Re: Procedure followed by State Board of Education in considering applications for transfer of pupils from one district to another. (Edward J. Aschenbrenner, Graydon W. Smith)

## 12-56 EARLE E. KOEHLER, COMMISSIONER OF LAW ENFORCEMENT

Legislature did not intend the limitations as to size of vehicles stated in Section 49-613(A) were to be applied to trucks or trailers moving or transporting implements of husbandry to or from the farm. The phrase "temporarily propelled, moved or transported" as restricted by "to or from the farm" is limited to a reasonable and proximate distance. (Elbert E. Gass, Graydon W. Smith)

#### 1-57 W. E. SMITH, PROBATE JUDGE OF ADA COUNTY

A photographic process may be employed by the probate courts to reproduce those instruments which are required to be recorded by the court. (William C. Roden)

#### 2-57 W. L. ROBISON, COMMISSIONER OF LABOR

(1) The laws of Idaho and supporting cases appear to authorize Commissioner of Labor to refuse to hold another election in similar factual situations where an employer has refused to meet with bargaining agent selected by employees in a prior election. (2) Should not hold new election unless employer by his conduct brings himself within the good graces of the law. (Harold A. Ranquist)

#### 3-57 HAROLD JOHNSON, STATE TAX COMMISSIONER

Licensing of pleasure boats — responsibility of enforcement, total h.p. a determinative factor of license fee, age of boat determines depreciation and boats in this state prior to April 1 and operated in this state during the year must be licensed for full year. (Elbert E. Gass)

#### 4-57 WARNER MILLS, LIQUOR LAW ENFORCEMENT

State Legislature, mayors and councilmen of a municipality may not hold a license for the retail sale of liquor by the drink. (William C. Roden)

#### 5-57 JOHN P. MOLITOR, CONTRACTORS STATE LICENSE BOARD

A general contractor who accepts the bid of an unlicensed sub or specialty contractor must suffer the disqualification of his own general bid; a subcontractor must be licensed before he may submit a bid on projects not financed by federal funds, or at or prior to the award of a subcontract in cases of projects financed by federal funds. (William B. Taylor, Graydon W. Smith)

#### 6-57 W. L. ROBISON, COMMISSIONER OF LABOR

An employer by contract cannot require the employee to pass on to him all moneys received as tips or gratuities. (Graydon W. Smith)

## 7-57 F. O. GRAEBER, ACTING DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC HEALTH Department of Health is authorized to take test samples of milk without making a tender of payment therefor. (Graydon W. Smith)

#### 8-57 ALL PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS

Trust Deeds and related instruments should be recorded in mortgage records in office of county recorder. (William C. Roden, Graydon W. Smith)

#### 9-57 H. F. GARRETT, EMPLOYMENT SECURITY AGENCY

Employment Security Agency is authorized to use Federal Reed Bill funds for purchase of real property and construction of office buildings used as local offices of the agency; that the Executive Director is authorized to enter into agreements for that purpose. (John W. Gunn)

#### 10-57 P. G. NEILL, STATE TAX COLLECTOR

A company-sponsored sickness disability benefit plan, whereby a company without monetary payment by its employees, provides for payments to employees when unable to work due to sickness or off-the-job injuries, comes within the term "health insurance" as used in Section 63-3013(4), I.C. No income tax may be charged. Deductible expense items for company. (Graydon W. Smith)

#### 11-57 RULON SWENSEN, STATE AUDITOR

Senate Bill No. 41, Chapter 295, S.L. of 1957, appropriating from the Highway Fund of the State \$35,000 to County Treasurer of Lemhi County for road repair and necessary construction is unconstitutional. (J. R. Smead)

#### 12-57 D. M. HERITAGE, U.S. PENITENTIARY, WASHINGTON

To acquire the status of legal resident of Idaho, only physical presence plus the intent to establish and retain domicile in this jurisdiction are necessary. (Graydon W. Smith)

#### 13-57 MINIDOKA COUNTY PROSECUTING ATTORNEY

The owner of a slaughterhouse must have all meat inspected except that which he owns and will consume himself or will be consumed by his immediate family.

#### 14-57 FRED CHARLTON, STATE LIQUOR DISPENSARY

Any carrier transporting or possessing alcoholic liquor which does not have affixed thereto the official seal or label prescribed by Idaho Liquor Dispensary to be delivered within the State of Idaho, but not shipped under the direction of the Dispensary, violates Section 23-610, I.C. (William C. Roden)

#### 15-57 E. C. PHOENIX, UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD

There is no statutory authority for the statement on the 1957 road map of Idaho as to highway accidents involving cattle on a road in unfenced grazing districts. (Graydon W. Smith)

#### 16-57 CHARLES HERNDON, ATTORNEY, SALMON, IDAHO

Mines and minerals in place are real property, minerals severed and brought to surface are personal property. Annual net proceeds tax is a personal property tax. Tax is a lien upon the mine or mining claim. (Elbert E. Gass)

#### 17-57 EUGENE COOK, ATTORNEY GENERAL OF GEORGIA

Constitutional amendments in Idaho become effective on the date of the voter ratification unless legislature incorporates an effective date within proposed amendment. (William B. Taylor, Graydon W. Smith)

#### 18-57 PAUL M. ELLIS, M.D., STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

The State Board of Health, as a body, may perform the duties of Administrator of Health, pending his appointment. (Graydon W. Smith)

#### 19-57 HAROLD JOHNSON, TAX COMMISSION

Chapter 68, 1957 Session Laws, is an unconstitutional enactment. (Irrigation Districts and Canals.) (Elbert E. Gass)

## 20-57 DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT, PROSECUTING ATTORNEY, JUSTICE COURTS AND PROBATE COURTS

That portion of Section 49-1103, Idaho Code, pertaining to negligent driving is unconstitutional and void. There is no such offense as negligent driving in Idaho. (Graydon W. Smith)

#### 1-58 P. G. NEILL, TAX COLLECTOR

Laws 1957, Chapter 163 (H.B. 167) is unconstitutional insofar as it exempts from taxation the interest income of foreign corporations from obligations secured by real or personal property in Idaho. (Elbert E. Gass, Graydon W. Smith)

## 2-58 RULON R. PRICE, JUSTICE OF PEACE OF IDAHO FALLS PRECINCT

A fine paid under a statute later declared to be unconstitutional cannot be recovered. (William C. Roden, Graydon W. Smith)

County Hospital income derived from operations or from a tax levy under Section 31-3613, I.C., may not be utilized to construct or enlarge county hospital facilities under the control of a county hospital board.

#### 4-58 WYNNE M. BLAKE, NEZ PERCE COUNTY PROSECUTOR

As long as the person in question maintains legal residence in the State of Idaho and otherwise meets the qualifications of an Idaho elector, there would seem to be no prohibition against taking the position with the United States Senator, in the capacity of secretary. (William B. Taylor, Graydon W. Smith)

## 5-58 DOUGLAS D. KRAMER, ATTORNEY, TWIN FALLS, IDAHO Banks and other depositories have a duty to report when they know of the death of a record depositor or one having access to a deposit of any nature.
